## This week

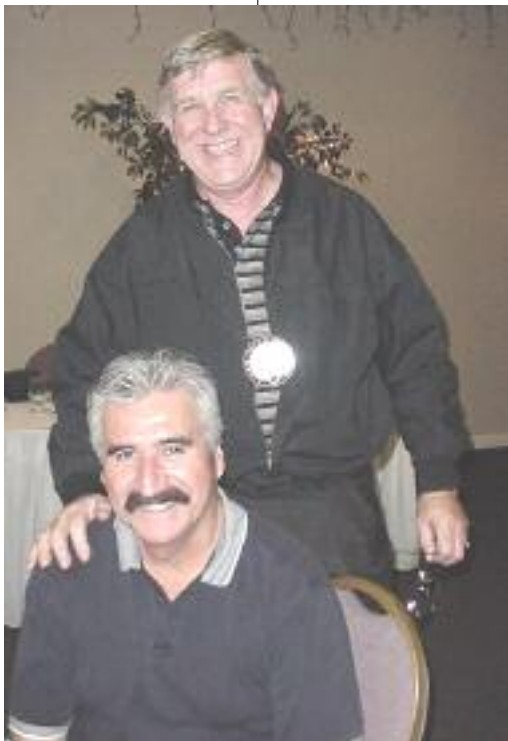
Our Special Guest today is Gil Ramirez, City of Oxnard Recreation, who will be talking about plans for College Park.

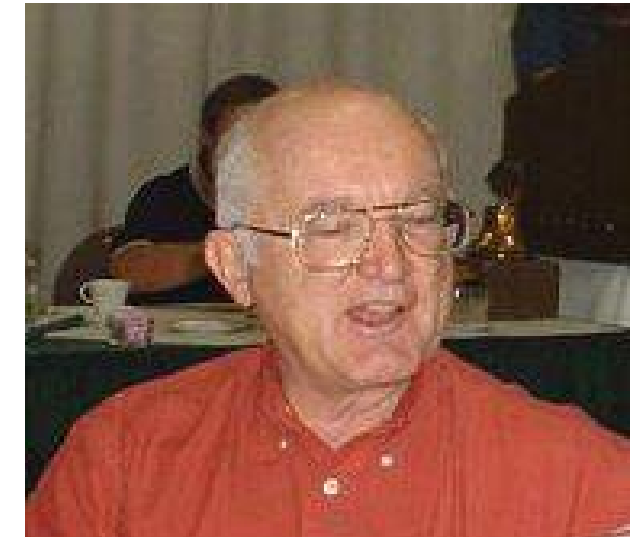
