REPRESENTATIVES FROM CHANNEL ISLANDS UNIVERSITY, CHANNEL ISLANDS GIVE UPDATE ON THE UNIVERSITY

Ms. Celina Zacarias. Director of Communications and Government Relations, and Ms. Tanya Garcia, Director of Alumni

and Friends, spoke to the Noontimers last week. They talked about CSUCI. The current enrollment is 3.600 students and the University is currently in its fifth year. Ms. Zacarias indicated that 43% of the students are from Ventura County.

Ms. Garcia indicated they have almost 3,000 alumni. The organization is currently looking for new members for the Alumni and Friends. Members can be alum, relative of alum or students, or anyone from the community. Membership is \$25 per year. She reported the group currently has 150 members, of which approximately 50 are staff members.

Both Ms. Zacarias and Ms. Garcia invited the Noontimers to hold a meeting on the campus.
