Jim Mays, from Lazer radio 102.9, a Spanish speaking station decided to talk a bit about his stations, the state of Spanish-speaking listeners in Oxnard and why companies should advertise on his station.

Basically, most native Spanishspeakers want to listen to broadcasts in Spanish because it takes less effort. Most of us are more comfortable in our native tongue. But most of them (85%) do speak English and those that don't bring someone who

does when they go where they might need translation, so businesses who have no Spanish-speaking help can still profit from advertising on their radio stations.

Some of the advantages of advertising with his stations are (1) because there are so few Spanish language stations, far fewer listeners station-flip during commercials, (2) every person listening to the radio



station hears the commercial, while many readers of newspapers never see most ads, and (3) most of the listeners are in cars or in situations where they are doing nothing but listening to the radio. They aren't doing housework with the TV running in the background where they never really hear the ads. Jim isn't a dynamic speaker, but he made good points, answered a ton of questions and was to-the-point. Good job..
